Tulips, blossom or shrub flowers and 'different' spring flowers were the most popular flower classes. 13 members entered an apricot and marmalade loaf cake. A new and tasty recipe to try.

The cups were presented by the mayor, Councillor Margaret Crick.

Victoria Middleton won the J & M Barber cup for most points in the Flowers and Plants section, and the Challenor cup for most points in Handicrafts. Angela Hughes won the Best Spring Garden cup. Rebecca Coles won the Scott Challenge cup for Domestic classes.

Laura and Alex Coles gained equal most points in the junior classes. All junior exhibitors received violas and an Easter egg for their original and fun entries.
