This year our Autumn show had a good supply of plants, flowers and produce even though the weather was very hot and sunny. We had 1 Summer entry, 8 children's entries, and 364 general entries. With 2 donations.

We raised:

As we were informed Bourton House Gardens is small, so it was decided to combine the two venues. Some of us had Coffee and Lunch in their small cafe located in a Tithe Barn with an interesting sloping floor! After lunch we boarded the coach for the quick transfer to Chastleton House and Gardens.

Garden tip

I have been given the following tip from a gardener who has used Caliente Mustard green manure to combat soil borne diseases 'Caliente Mustard 199 is an excellent green manure that has biofumigant properties. (Biofumigation is the suppression of soil-borne pests & diseases by the release of naturally occurring gases). By combining the lush organic matter with the plants biofumigant properties the activity of beneficial soil microbes is increased, so they can outperform the pathogen microbes and this helps keep harmful soil diseases down.'
